Start touching their paws, ears, mouth, and tail - basically, mess with them to get them used to humans handling them. Use positive reinforcement (petting, treats, play) to reward them when they don't react negatively.

In a similar vein, expose them to different sounds, people, and pets if you're able to. Make sure this is in a safe and enclosed environment, and to use treats and toys to make sure the kitten is having fun and not getting overwhelmed.

Use different types of toys and treats for training as well. There are various types of toys that imitate the hunting drive, and cats can learn tricks just as well as dogs (or better, in our opinion). If your environment and resources allow it, consider another kitten as a buddy for yours. Adult cats tend to be more independent, but kittens love having another kitten to play with.
